Supervised Visitation Awareness

The Supervised Visitation Center within Catholic Charities of Herkimer County provides a safe, neutral environment between a non-custodial parent or parents and one or more children in the presence of a third party who is there to observe and record the visit. Supervised visits foster a child's relationship with the non-custodial parent, in the absence of any conflict that exists between adults.

The month of May is Supervised Visitation Awareness Month. The purpose of this campaign is to bring attention to the importance of and need for this service. The color orange is used as a symbol of the Supervised Visitation Network, which consists of over 500 Supervised Visitation providers worldwide. Orange generally signifies safety, the main goal of supervised visitation providers, making it a fitting color for the network.

In honor of this awareness month, the Supervised Visitation Center of Catholic Charities in Herkimer County passed out orange ribbons and dressed in Orange to show their support.
