The Domestic Violence Program offers crisis and supportive services to victims of domestic violence and their children. Services include; safe, temporary shelter for victims of domestic violence, supportive courseling; support, accompaniment and

violence, supportive counseling; support, accompaniment and advocacy through legal, medical, housing and social services systems. We provide support group activities as well as information and referral. Community education and professional training programs are also offered.

We serve those affected by domestic violence regardless of religion, race, ethnicity, socio-economic status, marital status, age, physical ability, sexual orientation, or gender identity.
